Financial help you may be entitled to:

Warm Homes Discount

You could get £140 off your electricity bill with the Warm Home Discount. Ask your energy supplier to see if you're eligible.

Cold Weather Payment

If you receive certain benefits, and the average temperature in your area is zero degrees Celsius or below for seven consecutive days, you could get £25 for each seven-day period. Check eligibility at **gov.uk/cold-weather-payment/eligibility** or at your pension centre or Jobcentre Plus.


Winter Fuel Payment


